Attachment is a key dynamic in the Jewish approach to life. The Torah sets this principle out early as a fundamental aspect of human nature: “A man shall leave his mother and father and cleave to his wife...(Gen:2:24).” *Dveikut*, the Hebrew term for forming attachment to another person, is also the term used by Kabbalist and Chasidic teachers to describe the human attachment to the Divine Presence. In some religious traditions, equanimity and inner peacefulness are sought via a path of *detachment*. Not long ago, a successful, creative Jewish artist proudly told me of the progress she had made in life by “overcoming the problem of attachment.” I am all for letting go of resentments, hurts and disappointments, but I believe that the Torah teaches us that the high road to living a holy life is defined in large part by the attachments we form and the way in which we honor them. Each deed of kindness, generosity, helpfulness, sincere piety, learning and improving the lot of others helps draw us towards each other and towards our Creator.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE.....by Gail Weinstein

As I embark upon the presidency of the Emanuel Synagogue I have hopes, dreams and expectations for our community; some will be realized, some may be tried and meet with failure, and some dreams may stay as just that — dreams unfulfilled. Yet I am proud that I can build upon a firm foundation; for to me, the Emanuel Synagogue is so very much — it is a Beit Midrash, a house of study; a Beit Knesset, a house of assembly; and a Beit Tefillah, a house of prayer.



Theodore Herzl said, "If you will it, it is no dream," and thus I "will" that each congregant find his/or her own place within the Emanuel. The portals of entry into the Emanuel are boundless; whether through learning opportunities — adult learning or participating in family life programs; whether it be finding camaraderie and friendship through Sisterhood, Brotherhood; whether it be finding yourself at the time of your deepest loss surrounded by the caring and warmth of the Emanuel community as you gather with others to say Kaddish with the Minyonaires; whether it be through the support groups offered by the Emanuel to help you realize that you are not alone and there are others by your side to support you, welcome you, and truly care about you. Join with the Chesed committee in performing acts of kindness — one hour of your time can mean so very much to those who find themselves alone. The B'Yadenyu committee widens the Emanuel's outreach to areas of concern, addressing our Greater

Hartford community and beyond. Come to Shabbat services and stay for Kiddush — it is a time for friendship, kibitzing, and sharing. Find the entry point that speaks to you.

My expectation is that our Congregation build a closer relationship with Israel. Do we even realize how blessed we are to live at a time when there is a State of Israel? Perhaps we take it for granted, but as we gather in prayer (prayers that are 2000 years old) the longing for Zion has always been at the very core of our liturgy. At a time when the world seeks to isolate Israel and deem it a pariah nation, it is up to each of us to stand up for Israel — to read, to learn, to be Israel's advocates and staunch defenders. We must "teach our children diligently" so when they may

be confronted by groups challenging Israel's legitimacy they are able to rally around Israel armed with both knowledge and passion. It is time for us to realize, "If I am not for myself, who will be for me?"

My expectation is that our Congregation act responsibly, for responsibility and obligation are the very essence of Judaism. As "the chosen people" we were never given any special rights; but we do have obligations and responsibilities which must be fulfilled. GIVING is at the very heart of our tradition. And we shall all be called upon to GIVE...Our building is large and has served us well for the past 50-plus years, yet it is now in need of some TLC. Our sanctuary, so warm and inviting, has thankfully

NOTES FROM THE CANTOR — CONVENTION REPORT

From May 22 through 23 I had the privilege of attending the 64th annual convention of the Cantors Assembly in Toronto.



As always, the days were filled with learning, camaraderie, and inspirational music. I would like to share with you some of the more meaningful moments of this year's gathering, entitled "Building Tomorrow's Cantor Today."

As this was the first of our conventions to ever take place north of the border, the first evening concert was devoted to Jewish music by Canadian composers. The variety of solo and choral performances were beautiful, in a wide range of styles, but the most impressive presentation was a video recounting the life and career of Hazzan Louis Danto, z"l, who passed away last year. A Holocaust survivor, Cantor Danto served Beth Emeth Bais

Yehuda synagogue in Toronto for over 30 years, and was well known and beloved for his sweet yet powerful tenor voice, as well as his beautiful *n'sbomo*. He produced several recordings that I highly recommend to lovers of hazzanut.

On Monday I attended a session with composer, conductor and scholar Charles Heller. He has published a book entitled *What to Listen for in Jewish Music* that I plan to purchase and read. He gave a fascinating lecture about the origins of the "Hatikvah" melody that contradicted the theories that most of us have learned previously. If you are interested, you may borrow my copy, or I can direct you to his website.

Monday evening featured the premiere of a Ma'ariv service for soprano cantor and women's choir, composed and conducted by our neighbor, Hazzan Joseph Ness. His unusual harmonies and tonalities made the words of our

nightly prayers come alive in new ways.

On Tuesday night we attended an incredibly moving concert at one of the synagogues in Toronto that featured the Shinonome Chorus of Japan. These talented singers belong to the Japan Christian Friends of Israel and tour the world singing Israeli and other Jewish music in perfectly pronounced Hebrew and Yiddish. Their tribute, in Japanese, to the thousands lost in the recent earthquakes and tsunami left the entire audience moved to tears and filled with a sense of world unity.

In this spirit, the CA looks forward to our Musical Journey of Heritage and Healing next summer to Germany and Israel. I plan to hold at least one meeting in the coming months to inform our community of this trip so that as many people as possible may join me in this historic mission.

Thank you to the congregation for the opportunity to attend this important convention. I wish you a pleasant summer. Please join us for weekly Shabbat services and daily minyanim as often as possible.

WHAT'S NEW IN THE LIBRARY...

There is a new Milton Steinberg book! Milton Steinberg is the acclaimed author of *As a Driven Leaf*, published in 1939, as well as several nonfiction works, many of which remain in print. Rabbi Steinberg died in 1950 at the age of 46. At the time of his death, he was at work on a new historical novel, *The Prophet's Wife*, an incomplete manuscript that dealt with one of the more inaccessible prophets, Hosea, and his wife, Gomer. Most commentators begin their analysis with the assumption that when God told Hosea to "take unto thee a wife of harlotry," God was referring to the relationship between God and Israel. Steinberg took this literally and wrote a compelling story based on the relationship between Hosea and Gomer, and Hosea and God.

With the editorial help of Professor Ari Goldman of Columbia University, Rabbi Harold Kushner, author of *When Bad Things Happen to Good People*, and novelist Norma Rosen, the book published last year by Behrman House is a great read and provides insight into the end of the First Temple period. Anyone who enjoyed *As a Driven Leaf* will enjoy

this book as well. As a personal observation, *The Prophet's Wife* is a more engaging read from a literary perspective. Steinberg's efforts to teach his readers is woven more artfully into this book than his earlier one, and the development of the characters is very engaging. Without departing from his storytelling, Steinberg immerses the reader in Hosea's times, 8th century BCE.

It is an unfinished work, and it ends at a pivotal moment in Hosea's life. This is frustrating, of course, but the possible endings could be a fabulous subject for reading groups or for a group of our own, here at the Emanuel. Please email me at b.polebaum@comcast.net if you are interested in discussing this novel.

I hope there will be active interest among our congregation to read *The Prophet's Wife*. It is presently on the desk in the library. You are welcome to check it out — please write your name and email address on the card. For more equitable distribution, this book will be due 14 days after check-out. I hope you enjoy it. I wish you a happy, booky summer!

AUDRA WEISEL'S RED RICE AND BEANS

FOR YOUR ENJOYMENT, WE PRESENT AUDRA WEISEL'S WONDERFUL RECIPE FOR RICE AND BEANS. THIS DISH WAS ENJOYED BY MANY AT OUR MAY 5TH SHABBAT DINNER.

(Serves 4-6)

Ingredients:

- 1 14 1/2-ounce can whole, peeled tomatoes in juice, drained
- 1 small white onion, chopped
- 2 small garlic cloves, peeled
- 1/4 cup corn oil
- 1 cup medium-grain white rice
- 1 cup hot water
- 1 medium carrot, peeled, cut into 1/3" pieces
- 2-3 jalapeno peppers, seeds and ribs removed, cut into small dice
- 1 14 1/2-ounce can black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1/3 cup fresh or frozen corn kernels
- 2 Tablespoons fresh cilantro, chopped
- 1 teaspoon salt

Directions:

1. Puree tomatoes, onion, and garlic in a food processor until smooth.
 2. Heat a heavy medium saucepan over medium-high heat. When pan is hot, add oil. Add rice; stir until rice is pale golden, about 1 minute. Stir in tomato puree, then 1 cup hot water, carrots, jalapenos, and salt. Bring to a boil.
 3. Reduce heat to low, cover, and cook until almost all the liquid is absorbed, about 12 minutes. Uncover, add beans, corn, and cilantro. Cook until all liquid is absorbed, about 10 minutes longer. Remove from heat, cover, and let stand 5 minutes. Fluff with a fork before serving.
