FROM THE RABBI

Joy in the Face of Uncertainty: The Spirit of the Sukkah



The sukkah is the ideal pandemic structure. It allows for plentiful air circulation. Sukkot brings us out of our enclosed homes into the fresh air, with the stars visible by night and the sunlight by day.

Commentators tell us that the sukkah reminds us of the *Mishkan*, the portable sanctuary that our ancestors used out of doors during the wilderness years after escaping slavery in Egypt. According to the *TaNaKh*, the *Mishkan* remained the holy place for the nation in the Land of Israel for centuries, until Solomon built a temple of stone and wood in Jerusalem.

The *Mishkan* was built by volunteers and supported by free will offerings. The Temple was built by slave labor and financed by onerous taxation. As grand as the Temple was in its day, especially the Second Temple as renovated by Herod, there is a simple beauty to the original *Mishkan*, which means, “dwelling place.” We are told that the *schach* topping the sukkah reminds us of the Cloud of God that filled the *Mishkan* and hovered over it day and night. The simple design emphasizes the Spirit that dwells within, rather than the grandeur of the outer structure. Today, the limits on indoor assembly imposed by the

FROM THE PRESIDENT



It is apple-picking season. The evenings have a chill that foreshadows the coming frosts of autumn. We have tasted the honey that reinforces our prayers for a sweet year and soon will eat our meals together in the Sukkah. The rhythms of our faith are so very constant. They knit the years together in a steady reminder that while each New Year delivers different challenges and opportunities there is a steady flow and foundation on which we can rely when uncertainty intrudes upon our hopes and dreams.

We have closed the gates on the Jewish Year 5780. It was a most unusual year. A pandemic spread across the globe taught us all new ways to live. While some of these lessons and the restrictions they required were unwelcome, there were others that reminded us to treasure much we too often take for granted. We learned that to wake up each morning healthy and well is a gift. We rediscovered the bliss of a neighborhood stroll, a walk in the reservoir and the simple joys of our backyards.

Our Emanuel Synagogue and congregation proved to be especially resilient. Our Rabbi quickly developed

prayer rituals and halachic interpretations that allowed us to pray together via Zoom. Our daily minyan attendance grew. Our Shabbat attendance grew. Our B'nai Mitzvah rituals were modified to emphasize the family home as the primary foundation and sanctuary of our Jewish faith. Together we bonded even while distanced. Protecting ourselves from contagion didn't mean isolation from social interaction. The skills we learned along the way will stay with us far beyond the current crisis.

Our nation and communities faced the challenges of racial bias in a way not seen since the days of Martin Luther King Jr. We learned to have open conversations about privileges and poverty, about educational opportunity and oppression, about respect and dignity. We do not yet know if our mission to form a more perfect union is progressing but there is a renewed hope among many that the promise of our Constitution's equality for all is ascendant. These are certainly values that our Torah and Talmud embrace.

I am sure like me, you prayed this season for health and happiness. We did so, perhaps like we never did before. The words were the same. For me the intention


