

IN LOVING MEMORY OF HAZZAN SANFORD COHN

Excerpted from Rabbi David Small's eulogy at Hazzan Cohn's funeral on May 23, 2022

Hazzan Sanford Cohn earned Cantorial Ordination and a B.A. in Sacred Music from the Jewish Theological Seminary. Hazzan Cohn came to West Hartford, Connecticut in 1999, with his wife, Beth Polebaum, and their three children — Shoshanah, Aryeh and Gavriel — where they became an integral and beloved part of the Emanuel and the Greater Hartford Jewish community.

As Hazzan, Sandy showed great versatility. He learned beloved melodies and settings that were part of the Emanuel culture and introduced fresh tunes including those he composed.

He recruited volunteers to *Kol Shirenu*, Emanuel's adult choir, and established numerous youth choruses. Hazzan Cohn brought his groups to many local long-term care centers for Jewish enrichment. From Shabbat morning to the grandeur of the High Holy Days, he brought variety and spirit to Emanuel services and was a regular at morning minyan and the Minyonaires Breakfast Club. He mentored and taught adults to lead

prayers and to chant from our sacred scrolls. Hazzan Cohn was an integral part of our Emanuel Religious School, leading youth services on weekdays and Sunday mornings.

He trained hundreds of b'nai mitzvah students. Hazzan Cohn truly shone in our work with students with special needs. With patience and flexibility, he adapted the service to their abilities and set them up for success. Students and parents felt his devotion and care. In collaboration with [the late] Joan Glazier, Hazzan Cohn mentored pre-cantorial students from the Hartt School of Music. He worked with lay leaders on exciting musical happenings involving *hazzanim* and musicians of all kinds, from the great Alberto Mizrahi to the Afro-Semitic

Experience, culminating in an unforgettable cantorial concert gala in November 2019.

Hazzan Cohn became an able and willing partner in caring for and being there for our Emanuel Family in the most joyful and most trying moments of their lives. Whether singing gently at a *brit milah* or baby naming, or comforting a family at the bedside of a dying loved one, his sensitivity and *neshamah* (soul) were evident. Sandy had a special touch, his kindness and presence brought people much peace and comfort. Leading a shiva minyan or having a quiet conversation, Sandy let each person know he cared. At our weekly meetings, he often mentioned people who felt isolated or in need

FROM THE PRESIDENT — GOODBYE, DEAR FRIEND

The wound to the heart is fresh. The void too large. Seeing Cantor Sandy Cohn’s brother at Sandy’s funeral, I could see Sandy again. His Spirit is everywhere in The Emanuel.



When Sandy came to The Emanuel from Winnipeg, Canada, it was as if I already knew him. I knew Winnipeg because my mother was born in that city. I knew Canada because I was born in Montreal. My childhood idol was Sandy Koufax as he was the singularly great Jewish ballplayer. Little did I know then that this Sandy would also become a hero to me. It was about that time that I was starting to transition from being a three-day-a-year Jew to a regular Shabbat attendee. And then, as Sandy would lead Ruach Shabbat with guitar in hand, I slowly became addicted to Kabbalat Shabbat. Friday nights were spirited and fun.

Sandy and I had so much in common. We both loved being Jewish. We loved baseball. He cherished his Red Sox and I, my Dodgers. His love for music was infectious and it was not limited to hazzanut, although he loved hazzanut deeply. We talked Broadway, jazz, and, of course, rock ‘n’ roll. We spent hours talking about the music of Bob Dylan and Leonard Cohen and so many others. We traveled to New York to see David Crosby of CSNY fame at a beautiful old theater in the city. But truly, we both loved guitars and guitar music. I always wanted to sit down and play with Sandy. We got together in his backyard in the first summer of the pandemic and rocked out. His singing and playing were strong and he showed few signs of distress. It was the Sandy I knew and loved, and I was able to jam with him! What a memory.

Probably the best memories come from our collaboration on “A Cantorial

Celebration” in November 2019. We cooked up the idea a year before while having lunch one afternoon at Panera. The idea was to celebrate his 20 years with The Emanuel, in the context of celebrating 100 years of music at The Emanuel. We dreamed together of how to make it great. Step by step with the help of great friends, it became an incredible evening of music by Sandy, his friends and colleagues and those he mentored. More than 600 people were in attendance that night and love was everywhere. This was to be our last large gathering before the pandemic. Everybody now knows that Sandy did not share his diagnosis with the concert planners or performers until after the concert. This was an act of pure selflessness by Sandy. He wanted the spotlight on

the concert, not only on him. He also chose to delay treatment until after the concert so he could be at his best and he was. If you were there that night, you have a memory of a lifetime.

Sandy’s place in the musical history of The Emanuel is forever. He stands next to Cantors Arthur Koret, Dan Gurney, Thom King, Gideon Zelermyer and now, Daniella Risman.

Ultimately, I remember Cantor Sandy Cohn as an uber-mensch. He spoke quietly but authoritatively. His deeds of lovingkindness will be remembered by so many. We will miss you Sandy, but know well your memory will always bring a smile to our faces and be a melody in our hearts.



It is summertime, and the reading is easy. So grab your beach chair and sunscreen and enjoy these books!


The Prison Minyan, by Jonathan Stone


Zabar's: A Family Story, With Recipes, by Lori Zabar


Unknown Past: Layla Murad, the Jewish-Muslim Star of Egypt, by Hanan Hammad

Hammad's biography traces the life of the Egyptian megastar, born Lilian Zaki Murad Mordechai to a Jewish family in Cairo. It follows Murad's childhood through the singer and actress' rise to prominence as one of the country's top performers before retiring at age 38. She was a Jew who converted to Islam in the shadow of the first Arab-Israeli war. “Unknown Past” recounts her extraordinary life, framed by the political and sociocultural changes of 20th century Egypt.




Atomic Anna, by Rachel Barenbaum


