

**Sec. 7-175. Kinds of permits:**

Permits under the provisions of sections 7-170 to 7-186, inclusive, shall be of seven kinds

- **“Class No. 1”** permits allow the operation of a raffle within three months of the granting of the permit; the aggregate **value of the prize or prizes** shall **not exceed fifteen thousand dollars**. No more than one “Class No. 1” permits/ issued to any qualifying organization within any one calendar year. **Fee: \$50**
- **“Class No. 2”** permits allow the operation of a raffle within two months of the granting of the permit; the **aggregate value of the prize or prizes** shall **not exceed two thousand dollars**. Three “Class No. 2” permits/ issued to any qualifying organization within any one calendar year. **Fee: \$20**
- **“Class No. 3”** permits allow the **operation of a bazaar for not more than ten consecutive days**, excluding legal holidays and holy days on which the bazaar is not functioning. Any bazaar held shall be held within six months of the granting of such permit. Two “Class No. 3” permits/ issued to any qualifying organization within any one calendar year. **Fee: \$20**
- **“Class No. 4”** permits allow the operation of a raffle within one month of the granting of the permit and the **aggregate value of the prize or prizes** shall **not exceed one hundred dollars**. One “Class No. 4” permit/ issued to any qualifying organization within any one calendar year. **Fee: \$5**
- **“Class No. 5”** permits allow the operation of a raffle within nine months of the granting of the permit and the aggregate value of the prize or prizes shall **not exceed fifty thousand dollars**. five “Class No. 5” permits/ issued to any qualifying organization within any one calendar year. **Fee: \$80**
- **“Class No. 6”** permits shall allow the operation of a raffle within one year of the granting of the permit and the aggregate value of the prize or prizes **shall be not exceed one hundred thousand dollars**. Limit of five “Class No. 6” permits/ issued to any qualifying organization within any one calendar year. **Fee: \$100**
- **“Class No. 7”** permits allow the operation of a raffle within fifteen months of the granting of the permit, shall allow **no more than twelve prize drawings on separate dates** and the aggregate value of the prize or prizes offered shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars. **Fee: \$100**

The aggregate value of prizes offered under any of such permits shall represent the amount paid by the applicant for the prize or prizes or the retail value of the same if donated.

**Sec. 7-176. Permit fees.** The fees to be charged for permits shall be as follows:

- **“Class No. 1” permit, fifty dollars**, twenty-five dollars to be retained by the state at the time application for the permit is made and twenty-five dollars remitted to the municipality upon issuance of the permit;
- **“Class No. 2 permit, twenty dollars**, ten dollars to be retained by the state at the time application for the permit is made and ten dollars to be remitted to the municipality upon issuance of the permit;
- **“Class No. 3 permit, twenty dollars** for each day of the bazaar, ten dollars to be retained by the state at the time application for the permit is made and ten dollars to be remitted to the municipality upon issuance of the permit; a “
- **Class No. 4 permit, five dollars**, to be remitted to the municipality; a
- **Class No. 5 permit, eighty dollars**, forty dollars to be retained by the state at the time application for the permit is made and forty dollars remitted to the municipality upon issuance of the permit; a
- **“Class No. 6” permit, one hundred dollars**, fifty dollars to be retained by the state at the time application for the permit is made and fifty dollars remitted to the municipality upon issuance of the permit; and a
- **“Class No. 7” permit, one hundred dollars** to be retained by the state.

**Sec. 7-177. Prizes.** (a) All prizes given at any bazaar or raffle shall be merchandise, tangible personal property or a ticket, coupon or gift certificate, entitling the winner to merchandise, tangible personal property, services, transportation on a common carrier by land, water or air and to any tour facilities provided in connection therewith, or to participation in a lottery conducted under chapter 226. Such ticket, coupon or gift certificate shall not be refundable or transferable. **No cash prizes or prizes consisting of alcoholic liquor shall be given**, except as provided in subsection (b) of this section and section 7-177a, and no prize shall be redeemed or redeemable for cash, except tickets for a lottery conducted under chapter 226 or gift certificates awarded in accordance with subsection (e) of section 7-185a. For the purposes of this section, coins whose trading value exceeds their face value and coins not commonly in circulation shall not be deemed a cash prize.

(b) Any sponsoring organization authorized to conduct a bazaar pursuant to section 7-172 may award cash prizes not to exceed fifty dollars each in connection with the playing of a blower ball game. For purposes of this subsection “blower ball game” means a game of chance where the players wager on a color or number and the winner is determined by the drawing of a colored or numbered ball from a mechanical ball blower that mixes ping pong balls with blown air.
