

FROM THE PRESIDENT



As we look forward to the joyous holidays of Thanksgiving and Chanukah, it is appropriate to take a moment and look back at the bounty that has

been bestowed upon us in the last two months. As I write, I look forward to the Tribute celebrating our Rabbis and their wives and honoring Voices of Hope, an organization that provides Holocaust education to our community. By the time you read this, we will have experienced an amazing Shabbaton. In this message, I recognize our Rabbis for two specific and amazing moments during this year's *Yamim Noraim*. Both Rabbis gave us something very beautiful this year.

On Yom Kippur morning, Rabbi Small's Yizkor sermon was both timely and relevant to congregants from preteens to seniors. I tip my kippah to you, Rabbi Small. Sharing his personal family story inspired us to feel comfort and peace in reconciling some of our own private concerns. He encouraged us to remember special people who may have given us the courage and confidence to take on challenges; he encouraged us to provide the same support to our young congregants. His message, "We are all beautiful and valuable exactly as we are," struck a chord throughout the Sanctuary, Koret and Silverman and on Livestream. The introspective look at mental challenges particularly among our young and vulnerable populations speaks to all of us. Many congregants remarked this was one of the best sermons they had ever heard. The notion that we all are on the spectrum in one way or another resonates with me as it may with you. Todah Rabbah and Yasher Koach to our Rabbi Small for helping us to recall our past with fond memories and think about

how to make us more loving and accepting.

The second incredible moment and blessing came from Rabbi Lazowski on Yom Kippur afternoon. I have listened to him chant Jonah (Prophetic Portion) on many occasions. With a break in my responsibilities, I reveled in my third row seat directly in front of the shulchan. What I observed was nothing short of miraculous. We are all familiar with Rabbi Lazowski's story of survival. However, watching Rabbi Lazowski, age 91, standing strong after 24 hours of fasting, chanting the great tale of the Penitent and the Whale, was remarkable. I closed my eyes and heard a man half his age tell the story with great vigor. I felt as if I was in the belly of the great fish.

For both of these moments of grace and beauty, saying *Yishar*

Kochachem seems inadequate. These moments add to the many reasons we pay tribute to our great Rabbis. I, for one, am grateful to be president of a synagogue with two such exceptional and inspiring leaders.

I wish everyone a full Thanksgiving Table and a joyous Chanukah season.



ADULT EDUCATION NEWS

In September, Emanuel Adult Education co-sponsored an informative and dynamic talk by author Sara Aharon about the Jews of Afghanistan. October programs included a talk by Yale Professor David Sorkin about the Jews of Prussia in the first half of the 19th century. Prof Sorkin provided background about life in Eastern Europe in preparation for the Nov. 7 staged reading of Ben Engel's play, *Havdalah*. Tour guide Mike Hollander also led us on a virtual tour of Warsaw, Krakow and Auschwitz-Birkenau, emphasizing the history of Jewish life in Poland.

COMING UP:

Thursday, Nov. 4, 8:30 p.m.: "Who Will Write Our History?" with Professor Samuel D. Kassow. Trinity Prof. Kassow will tell the tragic story of the Polish historian Emanuel Ringelblum and his clandestine scholarly organization, the Oyneg Shabes which recorded the experiences of the Warsaw Ghetto's inhabitants from 1940-1943. Shortly before the Warsaw Ghetto was emptied and razed in 1943, the Oyneg Shabes buried thousands of documents from this massive archive in milk cans and tin boxes, ensuring the voice and culture of a doomed people would outlast the efforts of their enemies to silence them.

St. Petersburg & Moscow — The Pale and Beyond: Many Ashkenazi Jews say their parents/grandparents/ great grandparents came from "Russia"; however, most likely they did not! Jews, mostly, were not allowed to live in what is today the Russian Federation (including St. Petersburg and Moscow) until 1860. From that period until the Russian Revolution in 1917, this area was an anvil of Jewish creativity. In addition, major events here — including the assassination of Czar Alexander II in 1881, the Russian Revolution, the Great Patriotic War (WWII), the Cold War, and Glasnost - had tremendous impact on the Jewish population in this part of the world. They also had a profound impact on North American Jewry. This journey will visit these cities and examine how these events have and continue to impact Jewish identity in these


