FROM THE STUDENT RABBI

ow do you say goodbye in Jewish?" For many of my former public school students, most of whom came from immigrant and first-



generation families from Mexico and Central America, I was the first visible Jew they had ever known. I felt fortunate to get to be the person to widen their worlds, answering any genuine question about Jewish tradition. (Not always a simple task given Judaism's penchant for more questions than answers!)

So what is the Jewish way of saying goodbye? To the student who asked it, this was a simple wondering about Hebrew vocabulary, but the answer speaks to something deeper and more essential in our Jewish lives. Often we may say l'hitraot, which translates as "until we see each other again." This was the answer I gave my student, knowing that he would be able to map that onto the similar phrase *basta la vista* he knew in Spanish. L'hitraot is a reflexive verb, not a one-way action, which implies and necessitates that both sides anticipate a future reunion.

Another well-known Jewish goodbye is to say shalom, which — like the word aloha in Hawaiian or ciao in Italian — serves double purpose as both hello and goodbye.



But the Talmud cautions us to be careful in how we frame this wish for *shalom*, peace: *Al yomar lo lech b'shalom eleh lech l'shalom*

Rabbi Avin HaLevi said: One who takes leave from another should not say to him: Go in peace, but rather, Go to peace. As we see: Yitro said to Moshe: "Go to peace" (Exodus 4:18), and Moshe ascended and was successful. David said to his son, Avshalom: "Go in peace" (II Samuel 15:9), and Avshalom went and was ultimately hanged. (Berakhot 64a)

The change of one letter, from *lech b'shalom/*go IN peace to *lech l'shalom/*go TO peace, reminds us that even the rough experiences and bumpy patches of our lives can ultimately lead us to a place of peace, both within ourselves and between us and those around us. We never know what circumstances we'll face on the journey, but we can always hold it as a goal to reach peace, safety, and wholeness.

In fact, we can be those islands of *shalem*, wholeness, for each other. Peace doesn't necessarily mean always getting our way and never encountering any difficulty or heartache. On the contrary, how we respond and how we reach out to each other during times of difficulty are an integral part of our sense of wholeness. When we go to peace, we don't have to pretend we're always perfect. We can be content, even without needing to be always happy.

There is a traditional paragraph a Jew recites in Aramaic upon reaching the end of a tractate of Talmud, a massive unit of study that can take months or years to complete. We say,

Hadran alakh Masekhet _____ ve-hadrakh alan da'atan alakh Masekhet ____ ve-da'atekh alan lo nitnashi minekh Masekhet ____ ve-lo titnashi minan lo be-alma ha-din ve-lo be-alma deati

We will return to you, Tractate _____, and you will return to us; our mind is on you, Tractate _____, and your mind is on us; we will not forget you, Tractate _____, and you will not forget us — not in this world and not in the next world.

The learner may be closing the cover on this particular



tractate, and may not — cannot — return to study it again in the same way in the future. Even if they were to return and reread every word, it would be with changed eyes and knowledge. Yet the *hadran* acknowledges that when we have spent time in deep engagement with something, it changes us. We carry it away with us, even once we've gone onward to other endeavors, and we return to it again and again as we use what we have learned to make our way through the world.

Through my three years at the Emanuel, my mentor and friend Rabbi David Small has often quoted Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel: "What we need more than anything else is not textbooks but text people." You, the Emanuel staff, lay leaders, and congregants of all ages, have been my text people. Your enthusiasm and encouragement, ideas and creativity have made this a fertile ground for my growth as a rabbi, and I have cherished every opportunity both to teach and to learn from you.

Now, as I go out to become the Rabbi of a community of my own, I carry you all with me and will return to you again and again. Sometimes that may be through the magic of social media or zoom, and others that will only be in the heart, as my recollections of my time here help me to be the best rabbi I can in each moment.

Hadran alekhem, Emanuel. We will return to each other and we will not forget. L'hitraot, until we see each other again (especially if you're passing through the Boston area!) L'chu l'shalom, may you go to peace.



LISA'S JEWISH BOOKS CORNER


L ike so many Emanuel members, I am an avid reader and am always in search of book recommendations. Here are some Jewish books you may find of interest.

Squirrel Hill: The Tree of Life Synagogue Shooting and the Soul of a Neighborhood, by Mark Oppenheimer

Perhaps I have a bias as I know the author of this book, but I found this book very well written and so captivating. The reader will not only learn about the tragic events the day of the synagogue shooting, when a gunman murdered 11 Jews praying at Tree of Life synagogue but will be introduced



to many people in the Jewish community of this Pittsburgh suburb. Stories are also told of how people all over the country traveled to Pittsburgh to help in any way they could. Plus, Oppenheimer (who hails from Squirrel Hill and now lives in New Haven) gives us the history of this spirited, tight-knit and ultimately resilient community, one of the oldest Jewish neighborhoods in the country.



Plunder: A Memoir of Family Property and Nazi Treasure, by Menachem Kaiser

In *Plunder*, journalist Menachem Kaiser relays the story of his years of research as he tries to prove ownership of a building that belonged to his family before WWII in Sosnowiec, Poland. His quest is quite the adventure as he navigates the frustrating

legal system in Poland (a local lawyer warns him against going to see the building, a warning he promptly ignores). Kaiser has to prove his great-grandparents — murdered in the Holocaust — are in fact dead. During his research, Kaiser meets a group of treasure hunters who are searching for places where Nazis hid looted items.

The book leaves the reader with admiration for this author's determination to keep his family's legacy alive.


The Lost Shtetl, by Max Gross

Mysterious disappearances, bandits and murder plots make up this tale of a man named Yankel who is from the Yiddish-speaking shtetl of Kreskol and believes it exists as it was pre-Holocaust. It is a grand romp, full of suspenseful twists and turns.




The Last Kings of Shanghai: The Rival Jewish Destinies that Helped Create Modern China, by Jonathan Kaufman

This is a fascinating look into the history of two Baghdadi Jewish families in China — the Sassoon and Kadoorie families. *Last Kings* portrays the families building great wealth and living lavishly amid tumultuous historic change. The Communist takeover of China



in 1949 decimated their businesses, but the Kadoories redoubled their investment in Hong Kong, becoming its first billionaires.

The book is a bit repetitive, but it is a drama-filled story of ambition within a world of wars and upheaval.




Ethel Rosenberg: An American Tragedy, by Anne Sebba

Seventy years after the sensational trial and execution of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, for espionage, what do we know now about the guilt of Ethel Rosenberg? Did Cold War politics or antisemitism play a role in the case? Why did Ethel and Julius choose to orphan their two young sons rather than accepting deals that could have spared their lives?

All About Me! by Mel Brooks

Fans of Jewish funnyman Mel Brooks will enjoy this nostalgic memoir about Brooks' career as an actor, filmmaker and comedian. Each chapter is a behind-the-scenes look at his hilarious films and days writing comedy for Sid Caesar's variety shows. At age 95, he has earned his legendary status.



In March and April, we "traveled" virtually to Jewish South Africa, Venice and Prague. We got into the Purim spirit by partnering with Sisterhood for a stimulating presentation on the Art of Purim. We also heard the first two of the American Judaism series: a history with Prof. Jonathan Sarna, and an exploration of American Jews and white supremacy with Prof. Lila Corwin Berman. Rabbi David Wilfond, who participated in a Rabbinic mission with UJA of New York to the Poland/Ukraine border to bring medical supplies and aid to Ukrainian refugees in Poland, presented a timely Zoom update on the situation in Ukraine. Using Your IRA for CHARITABLE GIVING

If you have reached the age $(70\frac{1}{2} \text{ or } 72)$, when you are required to take a certain amount from your "IRA" each year, it is referred to as a "REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTION" (RMD). The IRS has "special rules" pertaining to "RMD's" that are very different from the rules pertaining to "IRA's" prior to reaching 70½ or 72. If you plan to make charitable contributions ("Qualified Charitable Distributions" -"QCD's") from your "RMD", it might be worth speaking with your tax advisor concerning the "special rules" pertaining to "OCDs."


