FROM THE RABBI



Purim encourages us to cultivate spiritual and emotional resilience in the face of hatred and peril. The Megillah of Esther speaks straight to Jewish people who live in lands governed by other powers. We learn

how to hold ourselves as minorities. Esther finds favor with all who encounter her. She gets along well with others. When the stakes are high, she advocates for herself and her people. She stands up, affirms her Jewish identity, and opposes enemies who would strip her and other Jewish people of their rights and their very lives. Mordecai carries himself openly as a Jew and walks with dignity in Shushan. He learns of a plot against the king and sounds the alarm, saving the king from death. Yet Mordecai will not bow down before Haman, a wicked and arrogant antagonist who asserts his enmity to the Jewish people.

Working together, Esther and Mordecai save the day for the Jews of the Persian Empire. They win the right for the Jews to defend themselves against their enemies and achieve victory. Our love of peace and kindness leads us to overlook the fact that Queen Esther was not the only one who risked life and limb; the Jewish inhabitants of Persia still had to fight to defeat the armed mobs organized by Haman with Royal approval. Ahasverosh revoked the charter given to Haman, but the Jews put their own lives on the line to defeat their enemies.

We celebrate their bravery as well as that of Mordecai and Esther. This timeless story reminds us that God gives us courage, and we must fight our own battles. We see the value of alliances with others in society and the ultimate importance of Jewish solidarity and courage. The social fun and sending of gifts and helping the needy create a positive environment for us to raise our spirits and our resolve in challenging times.

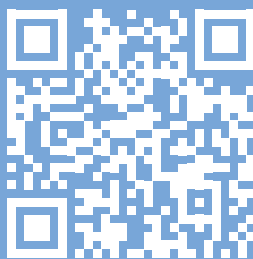

FROM THE PRESIDENT: *LET'S CELEBRATE ISRAEL AT 75*

In April-May 1998, my in-laws, both of blessed memory, visited Israel for the first and only time during the 50th anniversary of the declaration of the State of Israel. David Ben-Gurion made Israel's independence declaration at Dizengoff House in Tel Aviv on May 14, 1948.



My in-laws returned home greatly energized, and their enthusiasm was contagious. They talked about meeting my mother-in-law Lois' relatives, many of whom they met for the first time. Like many Jewish American families, their roots were in Eastern Europe, and due to the growing antisemitism there, some family members were able to immigrate to Israel. Gideon Spiegel, a first cousin, was a director of Bet Hatefutsot (Diaspora Museum in Tel Aviv) and had been on the faculty of Tel Aviv University for many years. Another cousin operated a kibbutz guesthouse. Pam and I then realized we had family we never knew.

When Emanuel's Rabbi Gerry Zelermeyer announced a congregational trip for the following year, we jumped at the chance to see our ancestral home. My brother Mel and his wife Carrie, of blessed memory, and their three girls had visited a few years earlier and talked about visiting their relatives (on Carrie's side of the family). Mel told me about a cousin in the Simon family who lived in Jerusalem. Chaya Rafael has lived in Jerusalem since the early 70's and had a fascinating job working in the Knesset as an editor of parliamentary questions. She had worked with and met many of the Ministers in Israeli governments in the years before her retirement. I have had many opportunities since to visit with Chaya in Jerusalem and have been thrilled to hear her stories concerning the architects of Israeli history.

Those of you who have visited Israel and family members who live there know what I mean when I say going to Israel is special and awakens something inside of us. For those who have not had this opportunity, I have only one word — GO!

Since that first trip, I have visited family and friends, rode my bicycle from Jerusalem to the Red Sea six times, enjoyed countless side trips in the Galilee, the Negev, the Golan and wonderful weeks in Tel Aviv and Jerusalem. My enthusiasm remains strong for this beautiful land that is ours, the Jewish State. West Hartford is sister city to Afula in the Jezreel Valley. There at Kibbutz Yizreel is a guesthouse built by and for us. That's right — you may stay there free when you visit Israel. Contact me if you would like to know more. I have enjoyed my visits there.

As you can tell, I am high on Israel. It is not a perfect country, and the politics are quite difficult. However, I accept its imperfections and will continue to support the country in any way I can.

We will celebrate the 75th anniversary of the State of Israel this year in West Hartford and especially at The Emanuel with a number of special events throughout April and May. These events will also be an opportunity for The Emanuel to conduct our only fundraiser of our fiscal year. We fully expect this will be a successful endeavor. These events will combine a fundraiser and a "funraiser."

On April 23, Brotherhood will celebrate the event with a breakfast at which those of us who have led tours to Israel and have participated in several events there will talk about the

NEWS FROM THE HOUSE COMMITTEE

A GENERAL NOTE ON FRESH AIR /VENTILATION IN OUR

BUILDING — In the past two years, we installed state-of-the-art digital wi-fi thermostat controls on every HVAC system in the building. They are set to deliver a constant flow of fresh air whenever the system is in the "occupied" mode, and to save energy when the rooms are not in use.

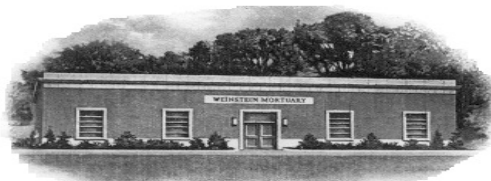
Every room or area in the synagogue building is receiving fresh outside air during occupied periods, through the heating and air conditioning systems. The recommended amount of fresh air is 25%, and this is what our equipment is designed for. This means we have four air changes per hour, in each occupied room. At any higher air intake rate, the equipment would not be able to heat or cool the air sufficiently or to function properly.

At the beginning of the Covid pandemic, all our HVAC units were checked and adjusted for maximum outside air. Our filters are changed twice annually.

Compared to the average home which typically has no provisions to bring in outside air, the air in the synagogue is safer and cleaner. Our high ceilings, and the ample size of the rooms enables us to spread out as much as we wish and to breathe clean, fresh air. We feel cold in the sanctuary partially because the fans are constantly bringing in more outside air, which must also be heated or cooled, depending upon the seasons.

These precautions are not guaranteed to prevent the transfer of Covid, if present, but we do hope our valued members and guests will feel more comfortable attending our many different functions and religious services.
