FROM THE RABBI

WE ARE ALL "CALLED UP"

In the aftermath of Oct. 7, we pray for the safety of the hostages and demand their safe return. The brave citizen soldiers of the IDF face the greatest danger and make the ultimate sacrifice. Around the world, every Jewish person is “called up” to serve and strengthen our Jewish community, support Israel and stand tall against antisemitism.



The December USCJ/RA/CA gathering of synagogue presidents, officers and staff, rabbis and cantors gives me hope. I witnessed 800 leaders united in courage, passion and solidarity with Israel, the Jewish people worldwide and each other. The predominantly young, motivated leaders showed unity of purpose. *In addition to direct support and advocacy to elected leaders and in the public square to affirm and defend Israel, we have a sacred duty to do everything within our power to build up vibrant, meaningful and dynamic congregations. Many American Jews awakened to their Jewish identity since Oct. 7; we offer a welcoming home for these seekers. Together, we continue to build an Emanuel Synagogue as “The Place to Be.” Throngs of parents and children who enter our doors represent the promise and the destiny of our congregation and of the Jewish People.

Please be a part of this sacred mission. May God bless us on our journey!

Our Sacred Legacy: Up Close & Personal with the Torah, our major fundraiser of the fiscal year, rolled-out on Simchat Torah.



The experience of seeing the Torah completely rolled out and holding the parchment was a very moving experience.

This is how the Manno family described the event: *Our family had a wonderful time at the Simchat Torah celebration. We really enjoyed getting the chance to be up close and personal with the Torah and helping to hold it up. Luca was especially excited to find his Torah portion for his upcoming Bar Mitzvah.*

Now, more than ever, we need to come together as one strong Jewish community; as an Emanuel community, to preserve our heritage and our Sifrei Torah. Please join me in becoming a Torah Restoration Project sponsor and meet our goal of 100% participation. There are levels from \$50 to \$10,000. All sponsors will have an opportunity to be *Side-by-Side with the Scribe* when he writes on the parchment in one of our Scrolls.

In addition, from January to June, we will be sponsoring educational and fun events including *How a Torah Changed My Life Forever* on Wednesday, January 17 (snow date January 31) with photographer Sheila Pally, co-author of "Light Beyond the Shadows: The Legacy of the Czech Torah Scrolls and the Renewal of Jewish Life in Czechia." This will be followed by *Torah, Tefillin, and Me* — a family program in conjunction with our Religious School on Sunday, February 11. Hazzan Risman will be teaching a *Torah Reading for Beginners* class (must have basic Hebrew reading skills) on Thursdays from 2-3 pm beginning February 22 and culminating with reading Torah on Shabbat, April 27.

Rabbi Edward Feld will be our Scholar in Residence on Sunday,

February 25. He has published widely on Jewish theology, prayer, the Hebrew Bible, and on halachic and ethical issues. He will speak to us about his recent book, *The Book of Revolutions: The Battles of Priests, Prophets, and Kings that Birthed the Torah*.

The project will be completed at a *Siyum* (completion ceremony) on Sunday, June 9 when the final letter is written in the Torah. This is sure to be a moving event felt by the entire Emanuel community as we reflect on the depth of what was achieved during the past year.

I encourage you to participate at a level that is comfortable for you. This is our only fundraiser of the year. Please join us for the special events. If you have any questions or would like to participate as volunteers and/or sponsors, please contact the chairs of this great undertaking, Randie Fierberg and Tamar Margolis, or you can always contact me. Let's make *Our Sacred Legacy: Up Close & Personal with the Torah* a participatory and successful synagogue fundraiser.

ADULT EDUCATION NEWS

In November we welcomed Norberto Lemcoff and Jeremy Rubock to the Adult Education Committee. In addition, in November, in preparation for Ben Engel's new play, *Domitilla*, **Dr. Steven Fraade**, the Mark Taper Professor Emeritus of Religious Studies at Yale University, spoke about what was happening during the time period of the play and answered questions from Ben and audience members about that time period. We traveled to Cuba virtually with **Abel Hernandez Eskenazi** and learned about the history of the Jewish presence in Cuba. In December, **Dr. Brian Gordon Hillman** spoke about the origins of Kabbalah in Medieval Europe and explored how Kabbalists understood both the nature of divinity and the relationship between G-d and the world. We also took a virtual tour of Jewish Greece with **Evan Kapros** and learned about the history of Greek Jewry, with its Sephardic, Ashkenazi and Romaniote roots.

Rabbi Small led discussions on current events in Israel, along with text study with the Natalie Ziplow study group Thursday mornings. All are welcome to join the group. Please contact Lisa Taylor at lisat@emanuelsynagogue.org to receive the Zoom link.

COMING UP:

Thursday, Jan. 4, 8:30 p.m., on Zoom: Dr. Eitan Fishbane, Professor of Jewish Thought at the Jewish Theological Seminary, will discuss the **"Ideas of G-d in Jewish Mysticism,"** exploring the varied ways in which Jewish mystical thinkers have understood the nature and character of Divinity.

Sunday, Jan. 7, 1:00 p.m., on Zoom: Travel virtually to Jewish Egypt with **Louise Arwas**, whose father, grandparents and great-grandparents came from Alexandria, Egypt, but were expelled, together with 30,000 Jews, during the Suez Crisis of 1956. She is currently involved in several related education projects, including organizing heritage tours to Cairo and Alexandria with former community members. She will take us from the time of Moses, through to the Golden Age of Egyptian Jewry, and right up to present day Jewish Egypt. We will visit an Egypt that was tolerant and open, yet indigenous and traditional, where Jews and their Muslim neighbors lived harmoniously, and extended, multigenerational families lived seemingly safe and joyous existences, along the way stopping at some of the most iconic Jewish sites in Egypt. We will remember what was — and maybe what can be again someday.

Thursday, Jan. 11, 8:30 p.m., on Zoom: The first of a three-part film series, the 1933 movie, **"Duck Soup": "Hail Freedonia!"** will be shown. As the rise of fascism threatened world peace, The Marx Brothers offered Hollywood's most hilarious — and unapologetic — comic send-ups of war and politics.

Sunday, Jan. 28, 1:00 p.m., on Zoom: Ron Gomes Casseres, who was born on the Dutch island of Curacao will present **"Stories from Curacao's Jewish History,"** a discussion about the Curacao Jewish community and practices.

Thursday, Feb. 8, 2024, 8:30 p.m., on Zoom: Dr. Eugene Sheppard, associate professor of Modern Jewish History and Thought at Brandeis University will present a virtual lecture on **"Theodor Herzl's Political Zionism in an Age of Empire, Nationalism and the Problem of Antisemitism."**

Thursday, Feb. 15, 8:30 p.m., on Zoom: The film **"The Jazz Singer: You Ain't Heard Nothin' Yet!"** Al Jolson's charismatic performance ended the silent era and made film talk. Learn how this landmark film gave millions their first look at the culture and faith of American Jews.

Sunday, Feb. 25, 1:00 p.m., on Zoom: Tour **"Jewish Portugal"** with **Glória Ribeiro**, who has a degree in National Tourist Guiding, and became Portugal's official guide in five languages in 2004. Highlights will include a history of the Jewish heritage of Lisbon which started in Roman times (if not before). There will be a virtual walk through Lisbon's historic downtown, where two of the Jewish quarters used to be located. The Alfama, the oldest neighborhood in Lisbon, still preserves the 8th century layout, and here, Jews, Christians and Muslims used to live and work side by side. For centuries after the expulsion, many "Conversos" kept practicing their faith in secrecy. The most famous examples are the Belmonte Jews, who until recently lived as an isolated community. We will also learn about the growing community of Porto, representing about 500 Jews from more than 30 countries.

Thursday, Feb. 29, 8:30 p.m., on Zoom: Rabbi Dr. Haim O. Rechnitzer, Professor of Jewish Thought at Hebrew Union College-JIR in Cincinnati, Ohio, and a poet, will discuss **"What is Judaism? — The Dispute Between Martin Buber and Franz Rosenzweig."** In 1923 Rosenzweig wrote an open letter to Martin Buber titled "Die Bauleute" (The Builders), accusing Buber that despite liberating "us" from the shackles of 19th-century academic objective engagement with "Judaism" and opening our minds and hearts to seek the "inner power" of the Jewish tradition, he failed to answer the crucial existential question "what are we to do?" Buber, of course, did not leave the question of action in this world unanswered. He provided a non-halakhic answer, arguing that the "truth" of Judaism lies in its religiosity, not its manifestation as a religion, or as Law. Our session will be dedicated to the exploration of these two opposing concepts of "Judaism" and in fact, of the ever-present existential question of "what are we (Jews) to do?"
