FROM THE PRESIDENT

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE, NOT JUST FOR NOW

The Board of Trustees, staff, and clergy are always looking to our future while continuing to meet the needs and interests of our community. We want to be financially stable and grow our membership. We are not alone in this desire.



Most synagogues own their buildings. However, owning a large space without a *space sharer* or renter is becoming increasingly difficult to manage financially. Many congregations are just beginning to talk about exploring leasing out space or moving to different, smaller spaces. We are ahead of the trend because we are already renting space to The Children's Museum and Preschool.

Programming is another major area of change. In the past, programs were developed and people would come to synagogues for those programs. But, needs change and people are looking for meaningful gatherings, connections — not just programs. What does this mean? We have five great examples at The Emanuel right now!

1. Community Shabbat Dinners bring members, prospective members and the community together to share a meal, meet new people, and get to know one another.

2. The Book Club was started by our Membership & Engagement Committee, along with a congregant (Sheryl Levin), for people interested in discussing books. This group continues to meet and grow — and you can join anytime.

3. The Natalie Ziplow Study Group was developed many years ago out of a desire for people to study together. Though there is rabbinic leadership, this group really helps drive the learning and sharing and meets virtually every week.

4. The Israel Affairs Group grew out of our Israel 75 celebration. Speakers on a variety of Israel-related topics bring members and guests together to share their passion for the Jewish State through activities, shared learning experiences and much more.

5. The Monthly Chapel Minyan is a Hebrew-rich, lay-led alternative to the traditional egalitarian Shabbat service held in the sanctuary. No electronics or screens are used, and everyone enjoys the intimate setting.

The common themes for these examples are member-driven, contemporary, timely topics, and planning based on the desires of the group. All of this leads to creating meaningful connections around common interests. This is the wave of today!

I encourage each of *you* to think about what interests you — and how we can partner with you to make it happen at The Emanuel.

Do you want to host a Shabbat dinner in your home and meet new people and invite old friends? Do you want to join one of the groups already happening? Do you have an area of interest, and do you and some friends want to brainstorm how we can create something new within our community?

Please reach out to us! We need help from our members to create and run these meaningful gatherings, but the staff are here to help you!

KOLOT — VOICES FROM OUR MEMBERS

Until Oct. 7, 2023, I am not sure I understood what being Jewish meant to me. This shift in perception might be resonating with many in our community who have witnessed a sudden surge of discussions and opinions regarding Israel, and the seemingly newfound religious fervor among Jewish individuals.

You might be wondering why so many of your Jewish acquaintances, who once remained silent on political matters, have become vocal and, some might say, “radicalized” in their views on Israel. The truth is, many young Jewish people, including myself, don’t consider ourselves particularly religious. We distance ourselves from the actions of political figures like Benjamin Netanyahu, and our Jewish identity might not have felt like a central aspect of our lives, until now.

However, recent events have forced a reckoning with our Jewishness. When faced with the rise of hostility and the disturbing calls for harm simply because of our bloodlines, a profound shift occurs. Colleagues who previously avoided political discussions now engage passionately. Friends who rarely post on social media suddenly share their thoughts. But it’s not a newfound religiosity; it’s a reaction to a world that, seemingly overnight, perceives us differently.

For many young Jewish individuals, our renewed connection to our Jewish identity is not rooted in religious practices or political affiliations. Instead, it is a response to the sudden realization that being Jewish, despite our personal beliefs, has become a significant aspect of our identity. When faced with threats and prejudice, it is only natural to seek strength in our generational connection.

This shift is not a testament to an ideological change but rather a consequence of external forces. It is a reaction to a world that has,

unfortunately, allowed baseless hatred to invade our safe spaces. When every institution and organization we once trusted seemingly turns a blind eye, our Judaism becomes more than a cultural background; it becomes a shield against hate speech and potential violence.

So, while the world around us may continue to grapple with complex geopolitical issues, my hope is that this period of self-reflection prompts a broader understanding of Jewish identity — one that transcends political affiliations and allows for a more nuanced dialogue about who we are and who we aim to be in a world that often sees us through a singular lens.

In embracing our Jewishness, we navigate the delicate balance between

the light and darkness that shape our identity. Let us find strength not only in our shared history but in our collective determination to challenge dangerous stereotypes and misconceptions. As we confront the challenges that come with being Jewish in a world that has historically left us out of the conversation, may this newfound connection to our identity become a catalyst for positive change within, and pave the way for a more inclusive and enlightened future for all.

2024 REPORT TO THE BOARD FROM THE CARING COMMITTEE

Dear Members,

I am pleased to provide an update on the recent efforts and activities undertaken by the Caring Committee to support our congregation members in times of need.

Our mission is to embody the Jewish value of **chesed** (loving-kindness) by providing compassionate support to Emanuel members facing health challenges, personal losses, and other difficulties. This aligns with the teaching from Pirkei Avot, “The world stands on three things: Torah, *Avodah* (service), and *Gemilut Chasadim* (acts of loving-kindness).”

To facilitate communication and coordination, we have created a Google Group named **Emanuel Cares**.

Since its inception, the Emanuel Cares Communication Group has successfully undertaken the following initiatives:

1. Support for the Sick: We have reached out to members who are unwell, offering emotional support and practical assistance. Our volunteers have made numerous phone calls to check in on their well-being and provide a comforting presence.

2. Transportation Assistance: Recognizing the need for transportation support, we have organized rides for congregants to attend High Holiday services, Synagogue functions as well as medical appointments. This service has been crucial for those without access to reliable transportation.

3. Meal Delivery: To offer comfort to those grieving the loss of loved ones, we have delivered homemade soup and challah. These gestures of kindness have been greatly appreciated and have helped to ease the burden during difficult times.

ADULT EDUCATION NEWS

PJP (Partners in Jewish Programming) presented a Zoom program in May by author **Sheila Pallay**, about her emotional encounter with a Torah rescued from the Shoah, now 250 years old, and how it affected her. Also, in May, **Dr. Shira Billet** spoke on Zoom about “**How Jewish Philosophers Think about Troubling Traditions**,” looking at how Jewish philosophers have attempted to resolve the contradictions and beliefs about what is right or wrong and how we ought or ought not to live. In a Zoom presentation rescheduled from February, **Rabbi Dr. Haim O. Rechnitzer** led us on an exploration of the opposing concepts of Judaism expressed by Martin Buber and Franz Rosenzweig and “what are we (Jews) to do?,” based on letters they wrote to each other in 1923. **Professor Alan Dershowitz**, who taught for many decades at Harvard Law School, gave a Zoom talk, moderated by **Rabbi Michael Jay**, titled “**University Anti-Semitism Will Only Get Worse!**” In addition, **Dalia Ziada**, an Egyptian writer and activist, discussed, “**Navigating the Geopolitical Crossroads: Insights from the Middle East**,” in a Zoom lecture at the end of June.

Rabbi Small facilitated discussions on current events in Israel, along with text study with the Natalie Ziplow Study Group Thursday mornings. He finished the year with an exploration of the Book of Job. In addition, Jerry Schwartz stepped in to provide stimulating teachings when Rabbi Small was not able to lead the class. Classes will resume in the fall. As always, all are welcome to join the group. Please contact Lisa Taylor, at lisat@emanuelsynagogue.org to receive the Zoom link.
