FROM THE RABBI

LIVING WITH UNCERTAINTY — CHOOSING A STANCE

At the writing of this column, I feel suspended between two worlds: the golden past of last September, when our new grandson arrived in Jerusalem, peace could be glimpsed on the horizon, and prospects for better life were tantalizingly near, and the horrific events of October 7, the brutal war that followed, and an uncertain future fraught with death, destruction and chaos. In times such as these, I remind myself that, while we cannot control many of the circumstances of our lives, we can and must choose our stance in any given situation. As Auschwitz survivor and author and therapist Viktor Frankl writes, the one thing that can never be taken from someone is the freedom to choose one's own way, to decide upon a purpose in life. Frankl also writes that when we have meaning in our lives, suffering becomes more bearable. Sacrifice and service to a larger cause helps us overcome the heaviest challenges and most profound pain.

The Hebrew Bible or TaNaKH, relates the story of the Prophet Elijah, who is being pursued by the forces of Queen Jezebel after confronting and killing many of her priests of Baal on Mount Carmel. Elijah flees to the wilderness of Sinai, and encounters God on the mountain. God asks, "Why are you here, Elijah?" The prophet hears the question as: "Why are you here, at this mountain at this time?" However, God's question was deeper than that: "Why are you here alive on this Earth? What is your unfinished task?" Redirected by the "still small voice" of the Divine, Elijah returns to Israel and appoints his successor, Elisha, to succeed him as prophet.

INVESTING IN THE FUTURE — KOL NIDRE APPEAL

The High Holy Days will soon be here, a time of renewal, inspiration and reflection. We have a vibrant and growing membership and continue to open our doors to those who wish to be members and live a Jewish life or closely associate with the Jewish people.

In 2022, The Emanuel Board of Trustees voted to establish a Step-Up Membership Ladder initiative that provided significant incentives to defray dues and fees for new members. In 2024, the Board reaffirmed the Step-Up Ladder Program believing that once we have new members in the door and they become engaged, most will



want to continue up the Ladder and become full-paying members within a few years.

The Board of Trustees firmly believes that our strategic decision to reduce the cost of new memberships to build the foundations of our future is the right thing to do. The early returns are promising: More than 90 percent of the 67 new households on the Step-Up Ladder Program have stayed with us going into Year Three of this initiative!

This year's Kol Nidre Appeal is earmarked to continue to provide the incentives for the Step-Up Membership Ladder initiative, while maintaining the high quality and affordability of our programs and services. This investment brings younger generations into our

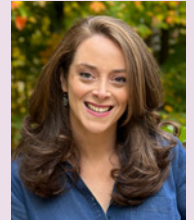

Shiri Sandler will be the guest speaker at a breakfast program on Sunday, Sept. 22, 9 a.m., sponsored by The Emanuel Brotherhood and The Emanuel youth community. Shiri is the Managing Director of the Agahozo-Shalom Youth Village in Rwamagana, Rwanda. She is the grandchild of Holocaust survivors, and she has spent her career in Holocaust and anti-genocide spaces. Driven by her Jewish heritage and her grandparents’ experience, Shiri worked for a decade as the U.S. Director of the Auschwitz Jewish Center at the Museum of Jewish Heritage and has spoken about the history and legacies of the Holocaust broadly.



As a student, Shiri was the Interim Chief of Staff at the Genocide Intervention Network, a Darfur genocide activism organization founded and staffed by students. Shiri is a board member of Voices of Hope and the Auschwitz Jewish Center. She has an MA in History from Brown University and a BA in History from Cornell University.

Joshua Shanes, Associate Professor and Director of the Norman and Gerry Sue Arnold Center for Israel Studies at the College of Charleston, will speak about "Zionism: Ancient Dream or Modern Revolution?" Zionism — like all forms of modern Judaism — considers itself an obvious consummation of thousands of years of Judaism and of Jewish longing for the Land of Israel. Yet, like all forms of Judaism today, it is quintessentially modern. It is in fact a secular revolution that draws selectively on Jewish tradition — choosing some texts over others, some traditions over others — to make its case for authenticity. This lecture

It is up to us to teach our children about our history; it is up to us to create a history worth talking about. Then it is our responsibility to mold our children so they can create a history for their children.

It is with this in mind that I am excited for the new school year to begin anew, to start fresh with our families and children and begin again the formal and informal Jewish education we have become accustomed to. I look forward to creating a new history with all of you, whether it is during Religious School, family programs, Shabbat dinners or services or holiday parties or all of the above. Let's not take this *kehillah* (community) for granted and begin to create a common history together. A history steeped in *emunah* (faith), *ahavat yisrael* (love for Israel), *achdut* (friendship) and *shalom* (peace).

HOUSE COMMITTEE REPORT

INTERIOR PROJECTS:

HVAC replacement was a big item for the House Committee this year. New heating and cooling systems have been installed in four areas:

- The Sanctuary
- Youth Lounge
- Koret Hall
- Library (Children's Museum Office)

Existing emergency lighting and exit signage was replaced where necessary in the school wing to pass the monthly 90-minute operating test as required for the Children's Museum and Nursery School.

One broken door and closer was replaced at the back of the sanctuary.

EXTERIOR PROJECTS:

- Coordinated with the Town of West Hartford for the repair of two sinkholes in our front lawn. The new grass is coming in nicely.
- Tree removal work on the north side of the parking lot and the south side of the building next to the school. Six trees, limbs, and vines were removed.
- Repaired three storm drains and a large pothole in the parking lot.
- Removed trees, shrubs, and bushes in the courtyard to allow clear sight lines out to the parking lot. The sunken area in the lawn has been filled in and the area where the bushes were removed was leveled. The new grass is coming up.

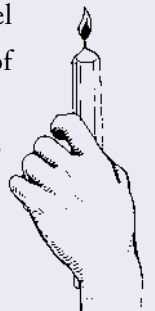
