FROM THE RABBI Rabbi Small Goes to Camp

Summer brings many wonderful activities; one of the best is Jewish summer camp. Fresh air, sports, fun, singing, and Jewish pride and spirituality abound.



My first experience with Jewish camp was in 1972 when my parents, with some help from Grandpa Small, sent me to Camp Ramah in Wisconsin. Although I was a bit homesick at times, overall, camp was a joyful and life changing experience.

I learned to read Torah, build model rockets, practice Junior Life Saving, how to paddle a canoe, play "shesh-besh" (backgammon) and chess, how to pray the weekday morning service, and how to say "please pass the pancakes" in Hebrew. I made friends with some of the other campers, like Jay (z"l) from Columbus who introduced me to authors like Martin Caidin and Isaac Asimov, and Benjie from Los Angeles (now an Orthodox rabbi) who taught me to talk like Donald Duck. We went camping in the North Woods, studied the laws of Shabbat, and mounted a Hebrew version of "Winnie the Pooh" as a musical play (I operated the spotlight). During six years as a camper and many more years on staff, I experienced profound identity formation and had meaningful experiences while growing as a person and in my Jewish life.

I still have connections with people I met at Jewish camp, as a camper and as a staff member. I went on to (continued on page 9)

After 18 months of planning, perusing, assessing and appraising, it is time to rededicate our Sifrei Torah and spring them back to life as kosher scrolls.

We have had two side by side scribing sessions to date, with two more to come in May. The experience has been indescribable.

Rabbi Hale has fascinated us with anecdotes of his experiences with his beloved scribing mentor Eric Ray. He has shown us scrolls that are more than 300 years old, a scroll from Yemen written on tanned deerskin. He showed us his tools of the trade — how to sharpen a goose feather to create a quill. Rabbi Hale's warmth and charisma provide for a once in a lifetime experience getting up close and personal with our most treasured possession, the Torah.

I have been empowered and reflective during moments of **insight** when I have had conversations with clergy, staff, congregants, and lay leaders that have stretched my thinking and perspective. I have heard positive feedback from participants in Chapel Minyan, Community Conversations during Kiddush, Book Group, Mah Jongg lessons, and the Torah Reading class with Hazzan Risman. Our Adult Education offerings have awakened and broadened our understanding of contemporary and timely topics.

The Emanuel Synagogue has many proud moments of being a strong, vibrant Conservative congregation. Moments of **pride** as we stand with Israel, committed to her existence and future. Show your pride by volunteering to serve on a committee or volunteering for a one-time project. We are forming a Hospitality Committee to recruit and place volunteers as well as Door Greeters for services, events, and High Holy Days.

In a world of Facebook, Instagram, and TikTok, where **connections**

are brief *likes*, emojis, and photos *moments of connections* can be difficult. Our clergy and staff truly value and care about each of us. Think about how you can be part of these moments, how you can contribute time and deepen your relationship with the synagogue...and with others.

HOUSE COMMITTEE REPORT

New HVAC Units: The two new Units for museum office and youth lounge have been installed. The removal and installation of the new museum HVAC unit and connections to the new electrical panel were completed and the unit was turned on and checked for heat. The second unit for the youth lounge was subsequently installed and activated.

Sanctuary Door: The new door has been installed at the sanctuary entrance.

Status of Security Infrastructure Projects — FEMA Nonprofit Security Grant Program

All five of the FEMA 2022 security projects are complete and operational:

- 1. Digital Security Camera System
- 2. Courtyard Security Fence with manual gates
- 3. Security Bollards to protect the Window Wall of the Silverman Auditorium
- 4. Multi Carrier Cell Phone Booster System for the interior of the building
- 5. Chapel Window Protection

Building Security System Upgrade and Automation of Courtyard Fence Gates

This project consists of upgrading the main controller for the Building Security System to allow expansion of capacity for the remote lock release function to extend to the fence gates under conditions warranting locking of the gates. Gates will also be fitted with operators to provide ADA access. Equipment is on order. Installation is expected in the April/May time frame.

Thank you to Tom Mastronarde for his work on the FEMA Security Grant upgrades.

Adult Education News

This spring, we traveled virtually to Jewish Iran with filmmaker, writer, and scholar of Mizrahi culture, Alan Niku. Dr. Michah Gottlieb spoke on Zoom about a debate waged before the civil war over whether or not the Bible considers slavery a biblically sanctioned institution. John Kenrick presented a discussion of the third in this year's film series, "Schindler's List." Dr. Andrea Dara Cooper gave an overview of how scholars and theologians have studied feminism within Jewish tradition, how gendered terms can be understood, and how these ideas can challenge and revitalize Judaism.

Rabbi Small facilitated discussions on the current events in Israel, along with text study with the Natalie Ziplow study group Thursday mornings. In addition, **Jerry Schwartz** stepped in to provide stimulating teachings on a few occasions. As always, all are welcome to join the group. COMING UP:

• Thursday, May 2, 8:30 p.m., on Zoom: Sheila Pallay will reprise her earlier presentation at The Emanuel in a further talk entitled, "How a Torah Changed My Life Forever," which tells the story of her emotional encounter with a Torah rescued from the Shoah and how it affected her. She spent three and a half months in the Czech Republic visiting synagogues that once housed the Holocaust Torahs (now housed in our synagogues) and photographing what is left after the Shoah. She and Julius Müller collaborated on a book, *Life Beyond the Shadows, The Legacy of the Czech Torah Scroll and the Renewal of Jewish Life in Czechia*.

• Thursday, May 9, 8:30 p.m., on Zoom: Dr. Shira Billet, Assistant Professor of Jewish Thought and Ethics at the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, will discuss "How Jewish Philosophers Think about Troubling Traditions." They are "troubling" when they conflict with

other strong beliefs we hold, be they epistemic beliefs about what is true or false, moral beliefs about right or wrong, or political beliefs about how we ought or ought not to live. She will look at methods that Jewish philosophers have articulated in attempting to resolve these contradictions, and gain insight into the history and practice of Jewish philosophy.

Thursday, May 30, 8:30 p.m., on Zoom: Rabbi Dr. Haim Rechnitzer of Hebrew Union College, will discuss, "What is Judaism? The Dispute Between Martin Buber and Franz Rosenzweig." In 1923, Rosenzweig wrote an open letter to Martin Buber titled "Die Bauleute" (The Builders), a letter that later became a central part of Rosenzweig's Jewish theological legacy. In "The Builders - Concerning the Jewish Law" Rosenzweig accuses Buber that despite liberating "us" from the shackles of 19th century academic objective engagement with "Judaism" and opening our minds and hearts to seek the "inner power" of the Jewish tradition, he failed to answer the crucial existential question "what are we to do?" That is, Buber's answer left the question of Jewish praxis, of Halachah, outside of the realm of possible answers. Buber provided a non-halachic answer, arguing that the "truth" of Judaism lies in its religiosity, not its manifestation as a religion, or as Law. This session will be dedicated to the exploration of these two opposing concepts of "Judaism" and in fact, of the ever-present existential question of "what are we (Jews) to do?"

News From The SISTERHOOD

The following are excerpts from Sisterhood President Rachel Arnett's speech during Sisterhood Shabbat on March 9.

Thave been a member of Emanuel since 1985. I attended Hebrew School here, ran through the halls and into the babysitting room here, and became a Bat Mitzvah here. Prior to becoming a Bat Mitzvah, I experienced a number of the usual milestones in my Jewish life: first Tot Shabbat, first Break Fast, first seder and of course, first time watching the movie "Yentl."

I didn't follow the romantic subplot of the film because I was so young, but I still remember being so confused about why Yentl's studying of Torah began in secret. Much later in my life, my grandmother, who was a Sisterhood President in the 1970s, sobbed openly when she heard my mother — a former Emanuel Sisterhood President read from the Torah for the first time on my sister's Bat Mitzvah. It took me years to gain insight into some of what she might be feeling that day.

As long as there have been Jewish women, there has been a place for Jewish women in ALL facets of Jewish life. For generations, women in Jewish communities were seen in a very specific, very narrow way. They were allowed to engage with Judaism in some ways but restricted from others.

I think of Ray Frank, the daughter of Polish immigrants living in California. She became a teacher of Bible studies and Jewish history. While visiting Spokane, Washington in 1890, she was invited to give a sermon during Kol Nidre services. She is widely credited with beginning to convince the established Jewish authority to consider ordaining women as rabbis.

I think of Henrietta Szold, the founder of Hadassah, who was admitted into the Jewish Theological Seminary in 1904, but only if she promised not to attempt to be ordained.

I think of Regina Jonas, the first woman in the world to be ordained as a rabbi. She was ordained in 1935, in Germany. Her sermons continued behind the barbed wire of Theresienstadt from 1942-1944, until her deportation to Auschwitz.

I think of Annie Fisher, an educator with roots in Russia who worked in and around Hartford, and who worked with a group of other women to start the Emanuel Synagogue Sisterhood in 1919.

In addition, I think of my great-grandmothers and grandmothers and my mother and my sister and her little one on the way.

The Women's League for Conservative Judaism, and our Sisterhood, is an organization of Jewish women

founded with the express purpose of "Engaging, Enriching and Empowering Women." Today's service is an example of what we are capable of. But it is only an example. We are capable of much more.

This year's Sisterhood Shabbat coincides with International Women's Day. The campaign theme for International Women's Day 2024 was "Inspire Inclusion," highlighting the need for intentional efforts to be made in diversifying leadership in private and public arenas. People of all genders belong on the bimah, and they belong in all places and in all rooms where decisions are being made that affect their lives.

Something many may not know about Women's League is that as an advocacy organization, they have posted resolutions on a number of important topics. I encourage you to visit their website to learn more about Women's League stances on everything from LGBTQ+ rights, Women's Reproductive Health and even fracking. It has been fascinating to read resolutions dating back as far as 1950, when the Women's League came out against the Subversive Control Act and called for the abolishment of the House Un-American Activities Committee.

Thank you to everyone who participated in services for Sisterhood Shabbat and in Sisterhood events in the past year. We hope to see even more of you at events in the next year.


