FROM THE RABBI



By a unanimous vote of the Board of Trustees, our Emanuel Religious School has been Dedicated in honor of Rabbi Philip and Ruth Lazowski. As the resolution of the board states: Our religious school will now be known as The Rabbi Philip & Ruth Lazowski Religious School.

It is a source of great joy and satisfaction that our leadership has seen fit to recognize the lifetime achievements of our beloved "Rabbi Laz" and Ruth. It is especially exciting to have our School Program bear their name at a time of growth and incredible creativity and accomplishment. Please see excerpts from Barbara Fink's report to the congregation:

"I started this school year talking about how I spent a lot of time in the car last summer listening to Billy Joel and the song "We Didn't Start the Fire" came on. For those of you unfamiliar with the song, Billy Joel wrote it to celebrate his 40th birthday in 1989 and chose the most important or influential pieces of history and culture for each year he was alive. The chorus goes like this: We didn't start the fire. It was always burning. Since the world's been turning. We didn't start the fire. No we didn't light it. But we tried to fight it. "Wow," I thought. "Why hasn't this song been updated? So much has happened in the world since Billy Joel turned 40- I was in 5th grade- now I'm....not." Anyway, the chorus landed differently with me as I had been spending a lot of time thinking about the history of Israel and the Jewish people and how I was going to help our amazing teachers teach these things differently.

So, this year, we did things like Sound On! with the Children's Museum on Rosh Hashanah, and Building Bridges on Yom Kippur, we canoed for Tashlich and we learned about the Book of Ruth at the Haunted Shul, we did Havdalah together, and learned about the night sky with the Museum's traveling planetarium. We instituted monthly Shabbat Story Times and Board games during Kiddish, we did a fun Purim Spiel and created an incredibly unique Shavuot experience complete with life-size puppets and bikkurim. We partnered with the Connecticut Invention Convention to teach how important innovation is in Judaism and in Israeli society.

We continued to host Kibbitz and Nosh, Tot Shabbat, and Family Services where our kids read Torah for the first- or 2nd time. We continued to teach our kids about the importance of tzedakah with a food drive and meeting



author Greg Siegman. Our 6th graders took our Gan class to Israel, we made hamantashen for Purim and matzah for Pesach. We participated in community-wide programs by grade level that included a Chanukah program, a Tu B'shevat program, and a Building the Old City of Jerusalem out of Legos program. We made Jewish memories to last a lifetime. . . .

As I continued to listen to Billy Joel, I remembered the world's problems did not start today and they will continue long after we are gone, but it is our job, as congregants, as parents, as teachers, as religious leaders to help fight those problems with knowledge. And it was at that moment that I knew that what we are doing here at The Emanuel is so important. It is so important for us to impart our knowledge and our history to our children, because as the song says at the end: "it will still go on and on and on." We will continue to teach our kids our history through Torah so that they can go on and on and on. And the fact that Billy Joel said, "We didn't start the fire" not I, reminded me that this important task is not mine alone, it is all of ours.

I am honored to serve as the Director of the Rabbi Philip and Ruth Lazowski Religious School. Rabbi and Ruth Lazowski's dedication to Jewish education is proof of the importance of teaching our children our history."

May The Rabbi Philip and Ruth Lazowski Religious School continue *L'dor Vador*, from generation to generation! We have witnessed wonderful learning and dramatic growth in the last few years. Tell your friends!

I am always amazed at how quickly the calendar flies by. Only minutes ago, I was preparing for

California Dreaming, a concert benefiting Friends in Deed and victims of the LA Fires. Thank you to everyone who worked so hard and gave of themselves to make it a rousing success.

Just three days and one Bar Mitzvah later, I traveled to Galloway, New Jersey for the Cantors Assembly Convention where I sang in a concert titled "Dor Chadash Dor K'vod" - celebrating the voices of the CA's newest members and retirees together. It was a thrill to be a part of this celebration of life, history, music, and the remarkable contributions of my friends and colleagues. The next day, the Cantors Assembly installed our new CA President, Rabbi Hazzan Jeff Myers. Rabbi Hazzan Myers is the Rabbi of Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh where he survived a horrific attack in 2018. The feeling of singing Shehecheyanu in chorus with over 100 Cantors to express gratitude for and celebrate Rav Hazzan Myers was uplifting beyond description.

Back at home at The Emanuel, in two months we have celebrated 7 B'nai Mitzvah and the birthdays of two nonagenarians. We are so privileged to celebrate, sing, learn, and pray together.

Meanwhile, the news of political violence across our country is disturbing beyond words, and Israel continues to battle for her very existence. My friend Shiri from the small town where I grew up wrote to me today, "Everything is closed. No school and no work. We stay near a shelter 24/7. In our case, we don't have a safe room in our house, so we're sleeping in a public shelter (miklat). Luckily, we live on the Yeshuv, so the kids can still meet friends and play close to a shelter."

I don't know how to heal our world's gaping wounds. I can only offer what helps me, and what Shiri expressed in this short paragraph. To find humanity in life, find ways to connect and express gratitude. Here in West Hartford, the opportunities are nearly limitless. Come to Emanuel for services, the Emanuel book club, Rosh Chodesh group, walk on Sundays to demand the release of the hostages, or simply come to kiddush at noon on a Saturday to break bread together. Hold the door for a stranger, call a friend, tip your waitress an extra few dollars.

Whatever it is, find a moment to make

your tiny corner of the world a better place - a more connected place. And then find gratitude for what you have, great or small.







Religious School News

Summer is a time for kids to run and play and swim and forget about school. It is a time for kids to try new things, like archery or zip-lining or sailing. It is a time where kids feel like they are not learning. But that is the secret of Jewish camp. Kids don't feel like they are learning. They don't know that they are growing and learning every single day.

In Parashat Shelach lecha, God tells Moses to send spies into the promised land to find out if the land is barren or fertile, inhabited, or empty and if it is indeed inhabited will the people be welcoming or try to kill the Israelites. So, Moshe sends twelve spies to the promised land, one from each tribe. Forty days later they return with mixed news. On one hand, they say it is paradise- it is eretz zavat, chalav ud'vash- it is a land flowing of milk and honey. On the other hand, there are ten spies who say the land is inhabited by giants and the Israelites are too weak to defeat them and have no chance of conquering the land. Two of the spies, Joshua, and Caleb, tell the Israelites not to worry that they can defeat the giants. The people don't listen and cry out in fear, begging not to go. God decides that the people don't deserve to go into the land of Israel. This causes them to wander in the dessert for 40 years. Enough time for a new generation to be born. A generation who was not slaves and therefore would be confident enough to conquer the land.

I always learned that God was all knowing, which leads me to wonder, if God is all knowing why did he need the spies to go into the land to "check it out?" Why doesn't God just tell Moshe what is inside the land of Israel? The answer is simple; God doesn't give us all the answers today nor did he in ancient times. The Israelites had to figure it out on their own. The spies weren't really sent to find out about the land of Israel they were sent to find out about themselves. To find out whether they were ready for the land of Israel, if they were ready to see all the potential that it had for them. They needed to see if they had the leadership and ownership that it would take to earn the land. They had to see if they deserved it and if they would fight for it. God doesn't just give, he teaches. He teaches the Israelites that they need to stand up for what they believe in and fight for it.

See, that is the great gift of camp, it is a time for kids to figure stuff out on their own. It is a time for kids to experience Judaism in every aspect of their lives without parents telling them how to think or act. Camp is the best place in the world. I should know, I have probably spent more summers in camp than not. It's my happy place. It's the place where I read Torah for the first time, the place I made my closest friends, the place I learned that there were lots of people like me. It was the place where I learned to play volleyball, where I learned silly Hebrew songs. It was the place I could be me.

Ben Platt, Tony award winner, and Camp Ramah alum was quoted saying camp was "the first place I was allowed to decide for myself what kind of Jew I would be." How powerful is that? We teach and preach and talk and show until we are blue in the face to our kids about how important Judaism is. But it isn't until kids go to Jewish camp- sleep away camp in particular- that they actually get to LIVE it and breathe it. The research has shown that those who attended a Jewish sleep away camp are more likely to identify as Jewish adults and engage in the Jewish community than those who did not attend a Jewish camp. Because it is when children and teenagers have to figure things out on their own and when we as parents allow our kids the space to be their own person and figure it out on their own, like God did to the Israelites, that we see what kind of Jew they will be.

Jewish camp is the most wonderful gift that we, as parents, can give to our children because it is the most powerful educational tool we have. (If you would like to talk about how we can help you send your child to Jewish camp next year- my door is always open!)

I wish all our campers the most wonderful summer whether it is here in West Hartford or away at an overnight camp. May you try new things and learn to be your own Jew. I can't wait to see you in the fall to see what you have become!


Adult Education News

During May and June, PJP (Partners in Jewish Programming) presented a program on Zoom with Don Seeman, Associate Professor at Emory University, about the how Israel can go forward as a modern democratic state that remains faithful to Jewish law and tradition, while meeting the needs of both Jewish and non-Jewish citizens.
