Religious School News

Thave been thinking a lot about the naming of our Religious School program in honor of Rabbi Philip and Ruth Lazowski- two people who believe so strongly in Jewish education and making sure future generations know our history.

For the past few years, we have had a special 4th-grade family program. We ask each family to bring in an artifact that was passed down from past generations, and then we create Jewish time capsules with our kids. At the end of the program, we sing L'dor vador from the *kedooshah* of the *amidah*. It is an incredibly moving program to watch as families link their past with their future.

There is a song written by Josh Nelson called L'dor Vadorfrom generation to generation. Part of it goes like this:

"We are words and we are stories, we are pictures of the past; We are carriers of wisdom, not the first and not the last. L'dor vador nagid godlecha L'dor vador... we protect this chain. From generation to generation. L'dor vador, these lips will praise Your name."

Education, like the Lazowskis, believe that we are doing just this-protecting the chain that links the present, the future, and the past together. Just because we are linked does not mean that our experiences with Jewish education will be the same as our children's or our children's children's experiences. We are always thinking of new ways to engage kids and their families in learning about our history, making it meaningful, and bringing joy to it. The Lazowskis have made it their mission in life to connect us to our past. By naming our religious education program in their honor, it enables us to connect the past to our future every single day. And I can tell you that our future is bright with the amazing children and families that walk through our synagogue each week.








Adult Education News

ver the summer, Norberto Lemcoff arranged to give us a glimpse of Israeli life with the in-person showings of two Israeli movies, America and Shoelaces. During September and October, a variety of programs planned by Partners in Jewish Programming are listed below. Programs will be on Zoom. Registration links will be included in the weekly It's All Happening at The Emanuel updates.

Thursday, Sept. 11 @ 8:30 PM: Finding G-D in the Material World. Daniel Matt will explore the question "How can G-d be encountered in our daily life" by teaching passages from Kabbalah and Hasidism on the nature of G-d, the act of Creation and the challenge of discovering G-d in the material world.

Thursday, Sept. 18 @ 8:30 PM: Neal Rechtman will lead us through the history of Jewish life in Barbados from 1654, when a contingent of 285 Sephardic Jews fleeing the Portuguese Inquisition in Brazil arrived. The restored Nidhe Israel synagogue in Bridgetown is the oldest in the Western hemisphere. This community thrived for 200 years, but then vanished in the 19th century when the sugar cane economy collapsed. In the 1930s, a group of Ashkenazi Jews fleeing the Nazi Inquisition arrived, and their descendants are the core of the current community of 50 souls.

Thursday, Sept. 25 @ 8:30 PM: Gadeer Kamal Mreeh, an Israeli Druze politician and journalist, will discuss The Druze Israeli Minority – Covenant of Blood. She will describe the strong and unique relationship between the Jews and the Druze, which started before the establishment of the state of Israel, relying on mutual values and goals, and today, it is considered a successful model of the integration of a minority in Israel.

Sunday, Oct. 5 @ 1:00 PM: Film historian John Kenrick will discuss the film Oklahoma.

Sunday, Oct. 19 @ 1:00 PM: During World War II, untold numbers of artworks and pieces of cultural property were stolen by Nazi forces. After the war, an estimated one million artworks and 2.5 million books were recovered. Many more were destroyed. The exhibition, Afterlives: Recovering the Lost Stories of Looted Art, at the Jewish Museum (NY) chronicles the layered stories of the objects that survived, exploring the circumstances of their theft, their post-war rescue, and their afterlives in museums and private collections. It also explores how the surviving artworks and other precious objects were changed by those events, bearing witness to profound historical ruptures while also acting as enduring carriers of individual expression, knowledge, and creativity.


It follows the paths taken by works of art across national borders, through military depots, and in and out of networks of collectors, looters, idealogues, and restitution organizations.

Forward! A Staged Reading of Ben Engel's New Play Sunday, November 16 at 7 p.m. Tickets will go on sale October 3

The Forward proved to be the newspaper that best understood and served an immigrant population eager to go from being "greenhorns" to being Americans. The play traces the origins of the newspaper in the strife-torn Yiddish labor movement from 1890-1903, as its longtime editor, Abraham Cahan, fights for control, and ultimately wins because his vision for the paper matched that of its readers.

Eric Hoffman will play the ambitious and conflicted Abraham Cahan, with Esther Aronson as his wife Anyuta. Fred Spaeth will portray Cahan's antagonistic ally, Louis Miller. Mel Simon, Rabbi Steve Chatinover, Hilary Silver and Marty Hirsh form a disparate quartet of Lower East Side Jews, each affected by events in his or her own way. You'll get to see Rabbi David Small play a prominent writer and a sweatshop boss!
