The Forward proved to be the newspaper that best understood and served an immigrant population eager to go from being "greenhorns" to being Americans. The play traces the origins of the newspaper in the strife-torn Yiddish labor movement from 1890-1903, as its longtime editor, Abraham Cahan, fights for control, and ultimately wins because his vision for the paper matched that of its readers.

Eric Hoffman will play the ambitious and conflicted Abraham Cahan, with Esther Aronson as his wife Anyuta. Fred Spaeth will portray Cahan's antagonistic ally, Louis Miller. Mel Simon, Rabbi Steve Chatinover, Hilary Silver and Marty Hirsh form a disparate quartet of Lower East Side Jews, each affected by events in his or her own way. You'll get to see Rabbi David Small play a prominent writer and a sweatshop boss! Lesley Weiner, Ken Simon and Eliana Tsukroff complete the cast, and Carolyn Topol will return as Narrator. We'll be in costume, and you'll hear music by Antonín Dvořák. The play is directed by Adrian A. Durlester and produced by Ken Simon. Elizabeth Ehrlich will be the costumer.







Adult Education News

During the fall, programming with Partners in Jewish Programming continued with presentations about Finding G-D in the Material World, The Druze Israeli Minority – Covenant of Blood, and The Shtetl: A Jewish Universe. We also had the opportunity to travel virtually to Barbados and learn about the history of Jewish life there. Film historian John Kenrick discussed the movies Oklahoma and South Pacific. Thursday morning Natalie Ziplow study sessions resumed, with Rabbi Small leading us through torah study and discussions of current events in Israel this fall. The November and December programs planned by Partners in Jewish Programming are listed below. Programs will be on Zoom. Registration links will be included in the weekly It's all Happening at the Emanuel eblasts.

Sunday, Nov. 2 @ 1:00 PM:

Nisya Isman Allovi, the Director and Curator of the Quincentennial Foundation Museum of Turkish Jews, and a proud member of Istanbul's vibrant Jewish community, will explore the Jewish heritage sites of Jewish Istanbul. A modern-day embodiment of ancient Constantinople, it presents



a breathtaking panorama of towering minarets and domes surrounded by water, bathed in a golden light from the sun. Within its many neighborhoods lie numerous synagogues, each with its unique narrative, telling tales of the Jews who built them and worshiped within.

Sunday, Nov. 9 @ 8:30 PM: Film historian, John Kenrick will discuss how Sholem Aleichem's short stories about a Jewish milkman in a Russian shtetl became a lasting worldwide hit in Fiddler on the Roof.

Thursday, Nov. 13 @ 8:30 PM: Ayelet Brinn, Assistant Professor of Judaic Studies and History at the University of Hartford, will speak about Abraham Cahan and the Rise of the American Yiddish Press, exploring how the American Yiddish press grew from unpromising origins into the diverse, successful publication market that it eventually became. Cahan's early career highlights the complex, often conflicting financial and ideological motivations that stood at the heart of the American Yiddish press, as well as the often-porous boundaries between American publishing markets in various languages at the turn of the twentieth century.

Sunday, Nov. 23 @ 1:00 PM: A Virtual Tour of the Once Jewish Towns of Eastern Europe will explore selected shtetls from all ends of Eastern Europe - Poland, Lithuania, Ukraine, and Belarus, walking down their old streets, looking at the Jewish homes, and seeing how general shtetl features are reflected in these particular towns. There will be a discussion of the relations between Jews and Christians, as well as the political and social life in these shtetls and how shtetl life changed over the centuries. Old and new photographs and people's memoirs will help provide some understanding of the life of our ancestors.

<u>Thursday, Dec. 4 @ 8:30 PM:</u> David M. Mizrahi Fidanque, whose family has been longtime members of

the Jewish community of Panama and pro-Israel activists, will take us virtually to Jewish Panama, which sits at the crossroads of the Americas and is home to its world-famous Canal, one of the busiest trading routes in the world and is also home to a thriving Jewish Community dating back over a century. It is perhaps the only country other than Israel to have had two Jewish presidents in



the XX Century. Home to more than 10,000 Jews, it is the largest continuously existing Jewish Community in Central America and the Caribbean. The presentation will give a historical, demographic, social, gastronomic, and spiritual visit to this small but outstanding community.

Sunday, December 14 @ 1:00 PM: Evgenia Kempinski, a professional Jewish tour guide, born and raised in St. Petersburg, Russia, will present Exploring the Lives of Jewish Children in Eastern Europe, discussing the rich tapestry of Jewish childhood in the shtetl, exploring daily life, family traditions, and the community bonds that shaped the futures of young lives in Eastern Europe.


